Text: Proverbs 18:1-24

Introduction

In the Book of Proverbs, Solomon divides the human race into one of two categories...The wise and the foolish. There appears to be no middle ground. Of course, he states many of the defining contrast between the wise and the fool.

As Solomon has done in the previous chapters, so he continues in this chapter. He offers more contrast between the wise and the fool. As a person matures and grows in wisdom, he cannot help but notice that the contrast of the wise and fool becomes more pronounced. We should carefully notice the contrasting of the lives of the wise and the fool. We see a contrasting of...
