## Prepare for the Future

Text: Proverbs 22:1-29

## Introduction

I.

The Bible is the most reliable and accurate "Handbook" ever printed on the subject of raising children. The principles of the Word of God have always proven themselves to be effective and true.

As we enter chapter 22 of Proverbs, we discover several "Life Principles" that should be taught to every child. These principles are focused on the future of one's life.

Too many people live their lives only for the immediate (i.e., today). They make day-to-day choices with little or no regard for the consequences they will face tomorrow. Many people look back over their lives and say, "I wish I had done things differently."

It is possible to avoid many of life's pitfalls without having to go through the school of experience. While the school of experience is a good teacher, the tuition is very high. It would be wiser, and less costly, to learn for the experience of others.

It is in this chapter that Solomon, through the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, gives us some sage wisdom about looking ahead. The truth is... *Tomorrow is only a day away!* It is also true that... *Tomorrow will be here before you know it!* 

In order to properly face the future, there are some basic principles that must be understood. In this chapter, Solomon defines three main principles that should be a part of life's core values in facing the future. These principles are not optional for anyone who desires to be wise and to live life to the fullest for the glory of God.
