The Marks of a Fool

Text: Proverbs 26:1-28

Introduction

I. His Foolishness (vv. 1-11).

In the previous two chapters, Solomon very clearly outlines the distinguishing marks of the one who is wise. He now begins, with the same clarity, to reveal the marks of the one who is a fool.

It is important that parents teach their children the marks of recognition. Too many parents today are more interested in their children looking like the latest fad or fashion, rather than demonstrating the characteristics of the wise. Parents <u>must</u> warn their children and help their children to be able to recognize foolishness and avoid it. In this chapter, Solomon defines several different aspects of the fool. Notice...
